EIP-INDIA SEMINAR

EIP-India as a part of EIP-International Geneva arranged one day Seminar for Junior college (Senior High School) students and teachers on Monday 7 October 2013 in Babananak Sindhi Hindi High School & Junior College, Nagpur. The theme of the Seminar was “Human Rights Pre-requisite for Peace, Democracy & Development. 84 students and 9 teachers actively participated in the seminar.

After inauguration of the seminar **Balkrishna Kurvey of EIP-India** made his power point presentation. He informed the meaning of EIP and work done by EIP-International in the world for spreading Human rights education. Kurvey informed in detail the articles of Human Rights and its need for the implementation in India and developing countries for peace, development and safeguarding democracy. India is largest democracy in the world and marching very fast towards development. For the sake of democracy and development, human rights must be spread and implemented from grass root, without which peace and development will be hampered.
